



Alpine Skiing Rules (Men / Women)

There will be a separate Men's and Women's USIC Championship. For the alpine Ski competitions, the ski specifications must comply with the respective FIS guidelines of the Master category.

1. Championship Program

Day 1: arrival of the teams, technical meeting and ID-Check*

Day 2: training

Day 3: giant slalom (2 runs)

Day 4: combination: morning: giant slalom (1 run), afternoon: slalom (1 run)

Day 5: slalom (2 runs), technical meeting

Day 6: departure of the teams

* Necessary documents from the Head of Delegation for the ID-Check:

Signed form "Declaration of Participation" and personal legitimation from the participants.

The opening ceremony will be held either on day 1 or day 2.

The excursion will be no more than half a day and will be held at the discretion of the organizers during the USIC championships.

2. Composition of the Delegations

Each delegation will consist of a maximum number of 11 (12) participants:

** for delegations who speak no English (only if required)*

3. Composition of the Teams

Each nation may enter with 6 men / 3 women competitors in each event.

4. Starting Order

For the Men's and Women competitors the following 3 groups will be formed:

Placings within each group will be drawn by lot

5. Individual Evaluation (Men and/or Women)

Individual evaluation of the Giant slalom event

The run times of both runs will be added for the individual evaluation of the giant slalom event

Individual evaluation of the Slalom event

The run times of both runs will be added for the individual evaluation of the slalom event

Individual evaluation of the Alpine combination event

The run times of both, the slalom and the giant slalom runs, will be added for the individual evaluation of the alpine combination event.

After each race the organizer must hold a medal ceremony at the finish area.

6. Teams

Each country may be represented with a separate men's and a separate women's team comprising a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 6 competitors for the men's USIC Team Championship and a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 3 competitors for the women's USIC Team Championship.

Any countries unable to enter the requisite number of athletes in the team event (i.e. a minimum of 3 in the case of the men's USIC team Championship and a minimum of 2 in the women's USIC Team Championship) may enter individual competitors.

7. Team Evaluation (Men and/or Women)

The best three finishing times, calculated by adding run 1 and run 2 together on each day of the USIC championship will be added for the overall standing of the national team's of the men's USIC team championship. For the women's team championship, the best 2 run times on each day will apply.

In both races the country with the lowest combined finishing time will be the winning nation.
